

Introduction

In this report, I'll go over how I finished my video and web production workflow, including pre-production, production, and post-production, as well as the technology I used to complete my portfolio website. I will also share my entire video production experience from beginning to end, including budget, location, obstacles I encountered during the shoot, how I dealt with and managed situations, and how the video turned out in the end. Each will be divided into sections and thoroughly discussed.

The script's overall goal is to show two different students' lifestyles and list the healthy and unhealthy habits they practice on a daily basis. Furthermore, I wanted to show the video in a split screen so that the acts could be performed concurrently, and the audience could see both healthy and unhealthy visuals on a single frame. When a person engages in unhealthy habits on a daily basis, it has an impact on both his daily life and, in the long run, when it is repeated.

Script Writing

With the script, it was easier for me to decide where certain scenes would be shot, how many characters would be needed for the play and what they would be doing in each shot and dialogues for them, whether my film would require a background music track or if it would be video narrative. The struggle is part of the story.

So, once the script was completed, I knew exactly what I wanted to do next. I was looking for characters and a location to shoot in. But it was the most difficult part. I only needed two people for the cast but thought it would be so simple, which turned out to be very difficult in the end. I was looking for a fit person to play the healthy role and a little fat guy to play the unhealthy role because I wanted to show a healthy guy on the left side of the screen and an unhealthy guy on the right side.

I was also working on my story board and shot list while looking for a cast and a location. So that once these are completed, I will have a clear vision of how each scene will be shot and will not run into any problems when it comes time to begin production.

Though I was able to find a large number of people willing to act in my short film, many of them only agreed to play the healthy role and refused to play the unhealthy role. After a few days of searching, I ran into the Vice President of Brunel, and while speaking with him, I felt that he would be a perfect fit for my healthy part, so I asked him. Despite the fact that he was extremely busy with work and other university commitments, he was nice and polite enough to hear my story and take the time to listen to me. When I told him about my script's story line, he was pleased and said that it was really a good awareness to people knowing what really makes them unhealthy these days, and that if we try to change a few small habits that we are following on a daily basis, it will make a huge difference in the future. I was overjoyed when he agreed to play the role of the healthy guy.

On the other hand, I was a little disappointed because I couldn't find anyone to do the unhealthy part. I felt it was time for me to step in for the role of an unhealthy guy because many people do not want to portray themselves as an unhealthy person on screen, so I decided to do the role by myself and thought it was time to step out of my comfort zone and face my fears in front of the camera. Even though I'm not very good at acting and don't have a pretty face, I wanted to appear on the screen for the unhealthy role.

Story Board

Like a film director, the first thing I put down on paper is a storyboard.

To put simply, storyboard is a sequence of drawing representing shots planned out for a video production. It almost covered my film's major shots, point of view, angles and played a vital part of the whole pre-production process since it quite literally points out how the story flows. I began by drawing my scenes with a pencil and paper.

As the saying goes, a picture is worth a thousand words, and a visual aid can help me make my points more effectively by displaying my vision to others when they are seeing it. Visualizing the story layout not only helped me explain the vision to others and make them understand it, but it also saved me a lot of time in planning my shot list and made my story vision run more smoothly.

Shot List

After finishing my storyboard, I began working on my shot list. So, basically, a shot list is a document that describes each shot in detail within a film to map out everything that will happen in a scene. The shot list forced me to consider what costumes, equipment, and props I would need to shoot a scene. Which location, whether inside or outside, would be ideal for shooting a specific shot? It also aided me in determining what comes first in the sequence. The main thing that simplified my work was deciding from which angle and point of view I would shoot a particular scene. It was useful in calculating the time for each scene, such as which scene required more time and how long it was necessary to set up the particular shot. All of these issues were resolved once my shot list was completed.

Because Archan was so preoccupied with university and work, I didn't want to waste any more of his time, so I decided to finish all of his parts first and then shoot mine. That's when I started thinking about how to make the most of my limited time. So, before we started the production part, I gave him the shot list, and he was pretty convinced and happy that this guy had planned everything and prepared very well ahead of time, giving him confidence to follow me into the battle. After that, I started my part. Since I was working in Split Screen, I was little puzzled by the format and how to create a shot list. But, with the help of the internet once more,

I eventually figured it out. I simply labelled each shot 1A and 1B, with the left part representing Archan and the right representing my part. As a result, it will be done differently for each scene. **SHOT LIST**





Camera Angles

Since everything was new to me, learning and trusting the process was enjoyable. I was very confused at first when starting the shot list, but yes, the story board did help me imagine my scene and decide which short might be perfect. Though I wasn't sure of many shots and angles, I figured I'd do it later in the production part based on the location and view. Because choosing the right angle and shot will always result in a perfect scene. I primarily used Eye Level shots, which are the most common, as well as some High Angle shots in my short film. I rarely used low angle shots because they were ineffective.

Video Production

Once all of the pre-production work has been finished, it is time to begin production. Everything was a bit delayed since I didn't have the equipment for the shoot on time, but I didn't want to use that as an excuse, so I attempted to use the time as efficiently as possible for other production-related tasks like hunting for locations, props, and costumes. I had a couple scenes both indoors and outside. For indoor locations like bedrooms and kitchens, I contacted a couple of my on-campus friends to lend me theirs, and they were pleased to assist me and give me their space for the shoot. When it came to the outside, I almost used the university open gym and park to film a couple shots of mine and Archan's portions.

I made certain to obtain some equipment from the institution, but due to high demand, I was unable to obtain the necessary equipment. Fortunately, a friend of mine in the UK had a camera and tripod that I could borrow. The Dedo lights alone were borrowed from the campus store. The film was shot using a Canon 1DX Mark II camera with a resolution of 4096 x 2160 pixels at a frame rate of 50 frames per second. Despite the fact that it was my first time handling the camera, I was able to learn more about it and its capabilities with the assistance of a friend. The reason for filming at 50 fps is that the footage will seem more smoother when slowed down. It was effective for tracking photos of individuals moving, shaking hands, and performing other slow-to-medium-speed activities.

I also used a Manfrotto tripod to restrict camera movement. With the tripod, I was able to achieve perfect camera alignment with no shaking and excellent composition. Then the Dedo lights came in handy to assist me indoors. The exterior shots were all captured in the late early hours of the day on the Brunel University Campus.



Before finishing the project, I double-checked that all of the shots were properly focused, white balanced, and lighted. Throughout the shoot, I held a shot list paper in my hand as a checklist to ensure that I was on schedule and didn't miss any scenes or shots. After the production portion was over, it was time for the major phase, in which I needed to edit the videos that were shot. The raw footage was edited, and colour graded with Adobe Premiere Pro. Since of the split screen aspect, editing the shots was a bit tricky because I had to make sure that all of the subjects in the shots were exactly centred and aligned with each other. It took some time to become familiar with the tool, but once there, it was a lot of fun. Despite the fact that I had no prior editing expertise, it was challenging but enjoyable process since I tried to learn something new every day throughout the editing stage. And also made sure to go with little warm and bright with the indoor stuff and I was able to make rapid and complex colour tweaks to the shots using the Lumetri Color panel in Adobe Premiere Pro. 




"A Winning effort begins with preparation."

"Roboto" and "DM Serif Display" were the fonts I used in the website. I wanted to use mostly black and white hues. Consider how much effort and sacrifice would be required to produce a three-hour film. But after working on video production, I now understand everything that goes on behind the scenes. I was overjoyed to learn everything in such a short period of time, and this adventure has been fantastic from beginning to conclusion. There were many ups and downs during the filming, but I was able to handle each one and gain more knowledge about the production, and now that I have my own short film, I can say that I am a proud director and actor as well.

There were so many takeaways, including how to write a script in industry standards, how to prepare a story board and shot list, how to make sure to take a friendly budget movie with the available resources, and most importantly, how to use various equipment, which is a huge plus for me because I'm not from a media background. Once the production job was over, I was able to learn a new software, Adobe Premiere Pro, and was able to colour grade and edit films while also adding music tracks and flawlessly synchronising everything to my demands, keeping my idea and vision alive. Also was excited to learn Webflow, which I wanted to learn and use to construct a website in for a long time ago but believed now was the right time to do it because it was extremely nice and, compared to other CMS platforms I felt this was lot cooler than others after using it. To be honest, there were so many positives that I can take away after finishing the video production and website work, and I aim to carry out these skillsets and use them wisely to needs in the future.
